

Question: What is Passover?

Passover celebrates the death angel "passing over" the houses of the Israelites and sparing their lives but striking the firstborn of the Egyptians. Elohim miraculously released the Israelites from slavery to the Egyptians and formed a new nation who served only Him.

Exodus 12:12 For I will pass through the land of Egypt this night and will kill all the firstborn in the land of Egypt, *both* man and beast; and I will execute against all the gods of Egypt judgment: I *am אור* 13 And the blood will be *find a sign* upon the houses where *you are*: and when I see blood, I will pass over you and the plague will not *come* upon *you* to destroy you when I strike the land of Egypt. *Prophecy Filfilled-Ex 12:13 The blood of the Lamb saves from wrath-Romans 5:8.* 14 And this day will be a memorial *for you*; and you will keep it as a feast to *find* throughout *all* your generations; you will keep *this* feast *as* an ordinance forever. C-MATS

Passover was fulfilled by the coming of the Messiah, which is the Lamb of יהוה :

1 Corinthians 5:7 Purge out the old leaven, that you may be a new lump, as you are unleavened. For even <u>Mashiach our Passover</u> is sacrificed for us: 8 Therefore let us keep the feast, not with old leaven, neither with the leaven of malice and wickedness; but with the unleavened bread of sincerity and truth. C-MATS

Romans 5:8 But Elohim demonstrates His love towards us, in that, while we were yet sinners, Mashiach died for us. 9 Much more then, being now justified by His blood, we shall be saved from wrath through Him. C-MATS

Question: When does Passover begin?

1. YOU SHOULD CELEBRATE PASSOVER ON THE FOURTEENTH DAY OF ABIB. (Before sunset but usually extends into the fifteenth of Abib)

Leviticus 23:5 On the <u>full moon</u> on *the* <u>fourteenth day</u> of the <u>first month</u> at <u>evening</u> (between sunset/darkness) is יהוה Passover. Deuteronomy 16:1 Observe את־ the month of Abib and keep the Passover to יהוה your Elohim: for in the month of Abib ליהוה your Elohim brought you out of Egypt by <u>night</u>. C-MATS

The first month of the Hebrew calendar is Abib or Aviv ("Spring"). The name of the month was changed to Nissan ("Miracles") while the Israelites were in Babylon. Passover falls somewhere between the months of March or April according to our Gregorian calendar. Passover is always celebrated on the fourteenth day on the evening of a full moon after the northern vernal equinox. The Hebrew calendar is based on the lunar cycle and our Gregorian calendar is based on the solar cycle. In 46 AD, Julius Caesar issued a decree changing the Roman calendar from lunar to solar, since the Romans celebrated sun god worship. The months of the years were changed to pagan gods or the names of Roman emperors. Pope Gregory XIII changed the calendar in 1582 to the calendar we now use today, but it is still based on the solar cycle. The dates of the feast days do not change, but the dates we celebrate the feast days change on the Gregorian calendar. Since we are now living under a corrupt calendar based on the sun, we must go back to our Hebrew roots and use the Hebrew calendar based on the moon as the Creator of the world intended us to use.

Question: How do you prepare for Passover?

2. YOU SHOULD REMOVE ALL LEAVEN FROM YOUR HOME BEFORE PASSOVER BEGINS.

Exodus 12:15 On the first day you will take away leaven out of your houses. C-MATS

Question: What is leaven?

Leaven or leavening agent is a substance used in doughs and batters that causes them to rise. Therefore you should remove any baked bread or cakes from your house. As Passover approaches plan ahead so you do not buy too much bread or products made with yeast. Buy just enough for your family to eat before the Passover begins, so you will not have to throw away any food.

Check your food labels for leavening agents or yeasts that must be removed from your house. Some of the commonly used leavening agents are baker's yeast, active dried yeast, baking powder, baking soda, cream of tartar or potassium bitartrate, sourdough, ammonium carbonate, ammonium bicarbonate, potassium carbonate, and potassium bicarbonate. Brewer's yeast and yeast extract are not leavening agents, because they are nonliving, dried yeasts, meaning the yeasts have been killed and have no leavening power.

Question: What commandments were given for Passover?

3. YOU SHOULD EAT A LAMB DURING PASSOVER.

Exodus 12:3 In the tenth *day* of this month every man will <u>take a lamb</u> according to house of their *fathers*, a lamb for *each* house: 4 And if the household is *too* small for one lamb, then let him and his neighbor next to his house *share it* according to the number of persons; *dividing it* according to the number of people eating the lamb. C-MATS

4. YOU SHOULD COOK THE MEAT WITH FIRE NOT BOILED IN WATER.

Exodus 12:8 And they will eat ******* the flesh that night <u>roast *it* with fire</u>. 9 Do not eat it raw or boiled in water but roast *it with* fire. C-MATS

- 5. YOU SHOULD EAT THE PASSOVER LAMB IN YOUR HOUSE.
- 6. YOU SHOULD NOT BREAK ANY BONE OF THE PASSOVER LAMB.

Exodus 12:46 In אדת one house it will be eaten; you will not carry any of the meat out of the house; neither will you break any of the bones. C-MATS

Question: Why was it so important not to break any of the bones of the Passover Lamb? *This is symbolic of Yahusha our Passover Lamb whose bones were not broken.*

John 19:31 The Jews asked that the bodies should not remain upon the stake on the Sabbath day, because it was the Preparation Day. That Sabbath day was a High Sabbath, so they asked Pilate that their legs might be broken, and that they might be taken away. 32 Then came the soldiers, and broke the legs of the first man, and of the other man who was crucified with Him. 33 But when they came to Yahusha, and saw that He was dead already, <u>they did not break His legs</u>: 34 But one of the soldiers with a spear pierced His side, and came there out blood and water. 35 And he that saw it gave his testimony, and it is true: and he knows that what he said is true, so that you might believe. 36 For these things were done, that <u>the scripture should be fulfilled, None of His bones shall be broken.</u> C-MATS

7. YOU SHOULD EAT THE MEAT WITH BITTER HERBS AND UNLEAVENED BREAD.

Exodus 12:8 And they will eat את the flesh that night roast *it* with fire and <u>eat it with unleavened</u> bread and bitter herbs. C-MATS

Question: What are bitter herbs?

Bitter herbs symbolize the bitterness and harshness of the slavery the Hebrews endured in Egypt. Some of the bitter herbs used in the bible are chicory, coriander, dandelion, and sow-thistle. Other bitter herbs include mint, sorrel, horehound, wormwood, and watercress. Romaine lettuce and endive are most commonly used today for Passover. Bitter herbs aid in digestion, which helps to digest the heavier meat.

Question: What is unleavened bread?

Unleavened bread does not use <u>raising agents</u>. Unleavened breads are generally <u>flat breads</u>. However, some flat breads contain leaven, so you have to check the package just to be sure. Some examples are pita, gordita, crepes, roti, tortillas, and matzo (matza or matzah). Matzah is usually used for the Passover Seder, because it symbolizes the affliction of Yahusha.

8. YOU SHOULD TEACH THE DELIVERANCE OF ISREAL FROM EGYPT DURING PASSOVER.

Exodus 13:8 And <u>you will tell your son in that day</u> saying, *This is done* because of what יהוה did for me when I came out of Egypt. 9 And it will be for לאות *sign (a mark) for* you upon your hand and for a reminder between your eyes that יהוה Torah may be in your mouth: with a strong hand is brought you out of Egypt. 10 You will keep את־ this הוא ordinance in His sacred festival (appointed time) from year to year. C-MATS

Question: What is a Passover Seder?

The Passover *Seder* (meaning order) is the scriptural command (Exodus 13:8) to tell the story of the Exodus to your children. The Seder that we use is at the end of this lesson, but be led by His Spirit how you want to conduct your own Passover Seder.

9. YOU SHOULD NOT ALLOW ANY UNCIRCUMCISED PERSON TO EAT THE PASSOVER LAMB.

Exodus 12:43 And הוהי said to Moses and Aaron, אמו *this is* the ordinance of the Passover: No stranger will eat it: 44 But every man's servant *that* is bought for money, *after* you have circumcised *him*, then he will eat it. 45 A foreigner and a hired servant will not eat it. 47 All the congregation of Israel will celebrate *it* (*him*). 48 And when a stranger settles with *you* and keeps the Passover to ליהוה , let all his males be circumcised *first* and then let him come and keep it; and he will be as one that is born in the land: <u>no uncircumcised person will eat it</u>. C-MATS

10. YOU SHOULD BURN UP ANY OF THE MEAT THAT IS LEFT IN THE MORNING.

Exodus 12:10 And you will <u>let nothing of it remain until the morning</u>; and that which remains until the morning you will burn with fire. C-MATS

Question: Should you put the blood of the lamb on your doorposts?

Exodus 12:6 And you will keep *it* until the fourteenth day of the same month: and the whole assembly of the congregation of Israel will kill אתו *it* (*him*)in the evening. 7 And they will take the blood and *smear it* on the two side posts and on the upper door post of the houses in which they shall eat it (*him*). C-MATS

Yahusha is the Passover Lamb. The blood of Yahusha covers your body and is a sign. When יהוה sees the blood He gives you life not death. There is no need to put blood on your door posts.

Acts 20:28 Take heed therefore unto yourselves, and to all the flock, over the which the Ruach haKodesh has made you overseers, to feed the assembly of Elohim, which <u>He has purchased with</u> <u>His own blood.</u> C-MATS

Question: What should you eat for the Passover meal?

The Scriptures only require that you eat roasted lamb, bitter herbs, and unleavened bread at your meal. You may add other items to your menu if you choose to do so.

Question: What should you do if you are not able to celebrate the Passover on the fourteenth of Abib?

11. YOU SHOULD CELBRATE PASSOVER THE NEXT MONTH, IF YOU DID NOT CELEBRATE PASSOVER IN THE FIRST MONTH OF ABIB.

Numbers 9:9 And אותי spoke to Moses saying, 10 Speak to *the* Children of Israel saying, If any of you now or in future generations is unclean because of a dead body or he is on a journey abroad, <u>he can *still* keep the Passover to ליהוה 11 *The* fourteenth day of the second month between the evenings they shall keep it (*him*) and eat it (*the meat*) with unleavened bread and bitter *herbs*. 12 They will leave none of it until morning or break any of its bones: according to all the ordinances of the Passover they will keep the Passover, that man will be cut off from among his people: because he has not brought the *offering* for אותי in his appointed time and that man will bear the consequences of this sin. C-MATS</u>

FEAST OF UNLEAVENED BREAD

Question: When should you celebrate Feast of Unleavened Bread?

1. YOU SHOULD CELEBRATE THE FEAST OF UNLEAVENED BREAD ON THE FIFTEENTH DAY OF ABIB (NISSAN).

Leviticus 23:6 On the <u>fifteenth day of the same month is the Feast of Unleavened Bread</u> to ליהוה: seven days you must eat unleavened bread. C-MATS

The Passover Seder begins on the fourteenth of Abib before sunset and continues into the fifteenth of Abib. Passover and the Feast of Unleavened Bread are usually considered an eight day feast since they run together.

Exodus 12: 18 In the first *month*, on the fourteenth day of the month <u>at evening</u>, you will eat unleavened bread until the twenty first day of the month at evening. C-MATS

Question: What commandments were given for the Feast of Unleavened Bread?

2. YOU SHOULD EAT UNLEAVENED BREAD FOR SEVEN DAYS DURING THE FEAST OF UNLEAVENED BREAD.

Exodus 12:14 And this day will be a memorial *for you*; and you will keep it as a feast to ליהוה throughout *all* your generations; you will keep *this* feast *as* an ordinance forever. 15 <u>Seven days</u> <u>you will eat unleavened bread</u>; on the first day you will take away leaven out of your houses: whoever eats leavened bread from the first day until the seventh day will be cut off from Israel. Exodus 13:6 <u>Seven days you will eat unleavened bread</u> and in the seventh day *will be* a feast to ליהוה. 7 Unleavened bread will be eaten *for* את seven days; and no leavened bread *will* be seen with you *throughout your territory*. C-MATS

Question: Why do you eat food without leaven during the Feast of Unleavened Bread?

The children of Israel ate the Passover lamb in Egypt on the fourteenth of Abib, but they were driven out of Egypt that night on the fifteenth of Abib. They did not have time for their bread to rise, so for seven days they ate unleavened bread in the Wilderness. We are to remember the exodus of our ancestors and their deliverance from bondage at this time. In the Bible, leaven is almost always symbolic of sin. Just as leaven permeates the whole lump of dough, sin will spread throughout a person eventually overwhelming him and bringing him into its bondage and eventually to death. We should examine ourselves at this time for sin, so we do not fall into bondage like our ancestors did. As we fast leaven bread, we should pray and ask for our hidden sins to be revealed to us, so we can repent and draw closer to Him.

Deuteronomy 16:3 You will not eat *any* leavened bread; seven days you will eat unleavened bread, *which is* the bread of affliction; <u>because און you came out of the land of Egypt in a hurry:</u> thus you will remember את־ day when you came out of the land of Egypt all the days of your life. C-MATS

3. YOU SHOULD NOT WORK ON THE FIRST DAY OR THE SEVENTH DAY OF THE FEAST OF UNLEAVENED BREAD, EXCEPT TO PREPARE YOUR FOOD.

Exodus 12: 16 And on the <u>first day</u> there will be a sacred assembly and on the <u>seventh day</u> there will be a sacred assembly for you; <u>no work will be done in *those days*</u>, <u>except that which every</u> man must *do to prepare his food to* eat, you may only do that. C-MATS

4. YOU SHOULD HAVE NO LEAVEN IN YOUR HOUSE FOR SEVEN DAYS DURING THE FEAST OF UNLEAVENED BREAD.

Exodus 12: 19 Seven days <u>no leaven will be found in your houses</u>: for whoever eats that which is leavened will be cut off from the Congregation of Israel, whether he is a stranger or born in the land. 20 You will eat nothing leavened; in all your houses you will eat unleavened bread. C-MATS

Deuteronomy 16:4 <u>And no leavened bread is to be seen with you in all your territory *for* seven <u>days</u>. C-MATS</u>

Eliminating leaven from your diet for seven days stops the yeast (Candida) buildup that can be so detrimental to your health. Yeast spores can even float around in your house, so that is why you should remove all the yeast from your house. All laws have been given to benefit us even though we cannot see the importance of why we should obey a certain law. Do not think that one law is not as important as another law. In His eyes all His Laws are important and have value for our lives.

5. YOU SHOULD KEEP THE FEAST OF UNLEAVENED BREAD EVERY YEAR NO MATTER WHAT COUNTRY YOU LIVE IN.

Exodus 12:17 And you will observe את־ Unleavened Bread; for in this day I have brought your armies out of the land of Egypt: therefore, you will observe את־ day, <u>in all your generations</u> by an ordinance forever (*owlam*). C-MATS

6. YOU SHOULD GIVE A VOLUNTARY OFFERING TO ELOHIM ON THE FEAST OF UNLEAVENED BREAD.

Exodus 23:14 Three times in the year you will keep a feast to Me. 15 את־ Feast of Unleavened Bread you will keep seven days: You will eat unleavened bread as I commanded you, in the time appointed in the month of Abib; because in it יפאר you came out from Egypt: And none will appear before me empty handed. 16 And the Feast of Harvest (Shavuot), the firstfruits of your labors, which you have planted in the field: and the Feast of Ingathering (Sukkot), which is at the end of the year, when you have gathered in את־ 18 You will not offer the blood of My sacrifice with leavened bread; neither will the fat of My sacrifice remain until the morning. 19 The first (best) of the firstfruits of your land you will bring into the House of The Your Elohim. C-MATS

Give to the poor at this time or a local charity that feeds the hungry. Be led by His Spirit as to where you should give your gift to Him.

TORAH LESSON for Passover Sabbath

Exodus 12:1 And יהוה spoke to Moses and Aaron in the land of Egypt saying, 2 This month *will be* the beginning of months: it *will be* the first month of the year for you. C-MATS

Question: What does the word "**month**" in Hebrew mean? Month means renewal. Just as the moon disappears at the end of each month, but returns and grows to fullness, so Israel may suffer exile and decline, but it always renews itself until the coming of the Messiah. (Chumash)

Question: What calendar did הוה begin for the Hebrews? The Hebrew calendar is based on the moon, and it is regulated by the sun. The length of the months is 29 or 30 days. A "leap year" adds a thirteenth month to the year seven times very nineteen years so that Nissan always remains in its proper season. (Chumash)

3 Speak to all the congregation of Israel saying, In the tenth *day* of this month every man will take a lamb according to house of their אב*ו fathers*, a lamb for *each* house:

Question: What does the word "**lamb**" mean here? The Hebrew word refers to both the young of both sheep and goats. There is no one-word translation in English. (Chumash)

Question: What is meant by "**house of their אב**ת *fathers*"? The father's house is what is known today as an extended family, such as grandparents with the families of their children. If this group was so large that one animal would not provide the minimum required amount of meat for each participant, then an animal should be used for each household. (Chumash)

4 And if the household is *too* small for one lamb, then let him and his neighbor next to his house *share it* according to the number of persons; *dividing it* according to the number of people eating the lamb. C-MATS



Eat Passover with your family.

Question: Why was it important to calculate how many lambs were to be prepared for each house? The people who will participate in the eating of each offering must be calculated according to how much they can eat, because all of the meat must be eaten that night or thrown away. ההוה does not want you to waste any food. (Chumash)

5 Your animal should be without blemish, a one year old male: you can take it from the sheep or goats: Prophecy Fulfilled-Ex. 12:5 A Lamb without blemish-1 Pet. 1:19. 6 And you will keep it until the fourteenth day of the same month: and the whole assembly of the congregation of Israel will kill אחנ (him) in the evening. C-MATS

Question: Why was Moses fearful to slaughter the lamb in Egypt? When אוה told Moses to slay the paschal lamb, Moses said: "Master of the Universe! How can I possibly do this thing? Don't you know the lamb is the Egyptian god? 'Lo, if we sacrifice the abomination of the Egyptians before their eyes, will they not stone us?'" Said הוה "By your life, Israel will not depart from here before they slaughter the Egyptian gods before their very eyes, that I may teach them that their gods are really nothing at all." This is what He actually did, for on that night He slew the Egyptian firstborn, and on that night the Israelites slaughtered their paschal lamb and ate it. (Chumash)

7 And they will take the blood and *smear it* on the two side posts and on the upper door post of the houses in which they shall eat אמו *it* (*him*). C-MATS

Question: What Hebrew letter did the blood over the doorposts make? Chet which means "life".



8 And they will eat אה־ the flesh that night roast *it* with fire and *eat it with* unleavened bread *and* bitter *herbs*. C-MATS



Gathering bitter herbs

Question: What do you think makes the **unleavened bread** we eat on Passover a symbol for being humble? The unleavened Matzah is flat and low. It doesn't puff up with air the way regular bread does when it rises. Therefore, it symbolizes humility and teaches us not to let ourselves get puffed up with conceited pride either. But more than this, eating Matzah on Passover can actually give us a big spiritual boost in our attempts to become more humble and better people as we focus on the symbol the Matzah bread gives us.

1 Corinthians 5:6 Your boasting is not good. Do you not know that a little leaven leavens the whole lump? 7 Purge out the old leaven, that you may be a new lump, as you are unleavened. For even Mashiach our Passover is sacrificed for us: 8 Therefore let us keep the feast, not with old leaven, neither with the leaven of malice and wickedness; but with the unleavened bread of sincerity and truth. C-MATS

Questions: Unbaked Matzah dough will not begin to rise as long as it's being worked and kneaded, but once it sits idle it begins to puff up and rise. What analogy do you think we can learn from here about human nature? As long as a person keeps busy doing worthwhile activities he is going to feel good about himself and have no need to put anyone else down, but once he 'sits idle' he is going to start feeling unproductive and bad about himself until <u>the only way he can build himself up is by putting others down</u>. A big secret of being happy is to keep busy doing things that count!

Question: Passover is the great festival of freedom when we remember and celebrate our people's miraculous freedom from the brutal slavery of Egypt. While physical and political freedom *is* important, there is even a higher type of freedom - freedom from being a slave to the destructive habits and desires which push us to do what we know we shouldn't. A person who can freely choose to act according to his values and not just his desires is truly free. Does being free mean being able to do whatever you feel like it? To be free doesn't mean doing whatever you feel like. <u>Real freedom is having the strength to freely choose to do what you deep down want to do even if part of you desires to do something else</u>.

Question: What do you think it means to be a slave to one's desires? Every person has two competing inner voices. One represents his true inner values that will lead him to personal and spiritual growth. The second is the desire of immediate gratification at all cost. Someone who acts upon that second voice is essentially enslaved by that desire and prevented from fulfilling his true mission in life.

Question: What types of things can make someone a slave? Many people are 'slaves' to junk food, or too much food of any kind. Alcoholics are slaves to drinking. Cigarette smokers are slaves to smoking. Illegal drug users are slaves to drugs. Some people become slaves to keeping up with the latest fashion or other ways of impressing people. In short, <u>anything that draws us to do it and we can't stop ourselves - even when we know we shouldn't or we just don't want to do it - can make us a 'slave.'</u>

Question: A free person is someone with self-control. What do you think this means? Self-control means that we are able to decide what we do or don't want to do - and then stick to it. This means we have the ability to freely choose and there's no greater freedom than that.

Question: Can someone be forced to do something by someone else - and still be free? While he may not be able to choose what to do, he or she can still choose what attitude to have, and choosing the most positive attitude possible within those circumstances sets one free.

Question: Do you think a person could be incarcerated in jail and yet be free? Yes. True spiritual freedom is not dependent on any external circumstances, rather it is the degree to which a person chooses to think, speak, and act in a way that best reflects his deepest inner values, within the limits his circumstances allow. Therefore someone even confined in a squalid dungeon could be essentially free, and conversely someone could be enjoying the best of luxuries and be a slave.

Spiritual Exercise: Use self-control this week and do not be a slave to destructive habits.

9 Do not eat it raw or boiled in water but roast *it with* fire; its head with its legs and with its *organs* in it. C-MATS

Question: How was the lamb cooked? One should roast it completely as one, with its head and with its legs and with its internal organs, and one must place its intestines inside it after they have been rinsed. (Chumash)

10 And you will let nothing of it remain until the morning; and that which remains until the morning you will burn with fire. 11 You will eat אתו *it (him) with* your loin's girded (*belt*), your shoes on your feet and your staff in your hand; and you will eat אתו *it (him)* quickly, it *is* to ליהוה Passover. C-MATS

Question: What does it mean "loins girded"? The Hebrews should have their belts tightened, and be dressed as if they were ready for an immediate journey out of the country. (Chumash)

12 For I will pass through the land of Egypt this night and will kill all the firstborn in the land of Egypt, *both* man and beast; and I will execute against all the gods of Egypt judgment: I *am* יהוה. C-MATS

Question: What judgment was placed on their idols? The idols made of wood will rot, and the idols made of metal will melt and flow to the ground. The demonic spiritual forces that guided and protected the destiny of Egypt were struck in this plague, so that Egypt would be completely defenseless. (Chumash)

13 And the blood will be לאת a sign upon the houses where את you are: and when I see לאת blood, I will pass over you and the plague will not come upon you to destroy you when I strike the land of Egypt. Prophecy Fulfilled-Ex 12:13 The blood of the Lamb saves from wrath-Romans 5:8. 14 And this day will be a memorial for you; and you will keep it as a feast to ליהוה throughout all your generations; you will keep this feast as an ordinance forever. 15 Seven days you will eat unleavened bread; on the first day you will take away leaven out of your houses: whoever eats leavened bread from the first day until the seventh day will be cut off from Israel. C-MATS

Question: When should you take all the leavened bread out of your house? The leaven must be removed before the Pesach-offering may be offered (or cooked). (Chumash)

Question: What picture of Yahusha do we see in the Matzah (unleavened bread)? The Matzah is striped. **Isaiah 53:5 But He was wounded for our transgressions, He was bruised for our iniquities; the chastisement of our peace was upon Him; and with His stripes we are healed.** *Prophecy Fulfilled-Isa. 53:5a Bears penalty for mankind's transgressions...Luke 23:33; 5b His sacrifice would provide peace between man and Elohim-Col. 1:20; 5c His back would be whipped-Matthew 27:26.* **C-MATS**

The Matzah is pierced. Zechariah 12:10 And I will pour upon the House of David and upon the inhabitants of Jerusalem, the spirit of grace and of supplication; and they shall look to Me את whom they have pierced; and they shall mourn for Him, as one mourns for his only son and shall be in bitterness for Him, as one that is in bitterness for his first-born. Prophecy Fulfilled-Zech. 12:10a The Messiah's body would be pierced-John 19:34-37; 10b The Messiah would be both Elohim and man-John 10:30; 10c The Messiah would be rejected-John 1:11; His body was pierced-Ps. 22:16; John 20:25, 27. C-MATS

Question: How is Yahusha a symbol of bread? Yahusha was born in Bethlehem, which means, 'House of Bread.' Yahusha called Himself the Bread from Heaven (Jn.6:31-51). The Bread from Heaven was born in the House of Bread. John 6:35 And Y'shua said unto them, I am the bread of life: he that comes to Me shall never hunger; and he that believes on Me shall never thirst. C-MATS

When we eat of Yahusha we are eating יהוה's pure unleavened Bread that is the staff of our life; the true Bread from Heaven. This is pictured in Matzah because unleavened bread symbolizes sinlessness and purity. יהוה set it up so that Yahusha, who is sinless and pure, could speak of Himself as Matzah: sinlessness, purity, and freedom. By eating of Him one attains Heaven: life eternal in the Presence of יהוה (Jn. 17:1-3).

16 And on the first day *there will be* a sacred assembly and on the seventh day there will be a sacred assembly for you; no work will be done in *those days*, except *that* which every man must *do to prepare his food to* eat, you may only do that. C-MATS


Question: What kind of work can be done on the first and seventh day of the Feast of Unleavened Bread? The necessary work for food preparation is allowed, even though it is not allowed on Sabbath and Yom Kippur. No other kind of work may be performed on these days, even though work can be performed on the other days of the feast. (Chumash)

Question: What is considered **work?** Any types of work that are considered by you as labor and necessities, where a monetary loss may be incurred if one would refrain from them, for example, something that will be lost if the activity is postponed. Work that is a burden, such as ordinary labor. Only such work is forbidden on festivals, but "pleasurable work", such as preparation of food, is permitted including slaughter and cooking.



Feast of Unleavened Bread

17 And you will observe את־ Unleavened Bread; for in this day I have brought את־ your armies out of the land of Egypt: therefore, you will observe את־ day, in *all* your generations *by* an ordinance forever (*owlam*). 18 In the first *month*, on the fourteenth day of the month at evening, you will eat unleavened bread until the twenty first day of the month at evening. 19 Seven days no leaven will be found in your houses: for whoever eats that which is leavened will be cut off from the Congregation of Israel, whether he is a stranger or born in the land. 20 You will eat nothing leavened; in all your houses you will eat unleavened bread. C-MATS



No leaven shall be in your houses.

Question: Eating Matzah bread helps remind us of the value of being humble - like the humble, unleavened Matzah - rather than all inflated and full of ourselves. What does it mean to be humble? It means not looking down on others or trying to put them down. Rather, treating everyone with sincere respect and doing what we can to help them. If you put down others, you are building up yourself. You are comparing yourself to that person and saying, "I am better than that person." All men have faults, but we need to focus on our own faults and correct them first.

Matt 7:1 Judge not, that you be not judged. 2 For with what judgment you judge, you shall be judged: and with what measure you use, it shall be measured to you again. 3 And why look at the speck that is in your brother's eye and not consider the log that is in your own eye? 4 Or how will you say to your brother, Let me pull out the speck out of your eye; and a log is in your own eye? 5 You hypocrite, first cast out the log out of your own eye; and then you can see clearly to cast the speck out of your brother's eye. C-MATS


Question: Moses' great humility was what enabled him to come so close to יהוה. What do you think is the connection? A person who is humble is always looking for ways to give to others rather than demanding that others give to him. As יהוה is the ultimate giver, the humble person comes close to Him by imitating His ways.

Question: What is the difference between healthy self-esteem and false, puffed up pride? Selfesteem is an inner attitude in which we recognize that our self worth does not depend on other's approval. False pride is the opposite, it is when we define ourselves in others eyes and demand of them that they sustain our feelings of self worth be giving us their honor and approval. If we truly respect ourselves, we will not be overly moved even if others don't treat us with the proper respect.

Question: What attitude do you think could help prevent us from puffing up with false pride and feeling insulted over things? One powerful tool is to remember that <u>nobody can say or do anything to us unless יהוה allows them to and יהוה only allows it if it will ultimately be for our best good.</u> In fact, being insulted by someone and not responding angrily is one of the quickest and most effective ways to build character and achieve spiritual growth. While we shouldn't seek these experiences, if and when they happen we should seize the opportunity to use them to grow.

Spiritual exercise: Do not criticize others, but look at yourself and put yourself in order during this Feast of Unleavened Bread. Try to become more humble and think of ways you can do so in your life. What does יהוה want you to change this week?

21 Then Moses called for all the elders of Israel and said to them, Take a lamb according to *the number in your* family and kill the Passover *lamb*. 22 And you take a אנדת *bunch of* hyssop and dip *it* in the blood that *is* in the basin and smear the lintel (*overhead door*) and the two side posts with the blood that *is* in the basin; מחט *and you* will not go out of the door of your house until the morning. C-MATS



23 For את־ will pass through to kill את־ the Egyptians; and when he sees את־ the blood upon the lintel and on the two side posts, את־ will pass over the door and will not allow the Destroyer to come into your houses to strike you. 24 And you will observe and will not allow the Destroyer to you and your sons forever (*owlam*). 25 And it will come to pass, when you have come to the land which את־ will give you, as He has promised, that you will keep את־ this service. 26 And it will come to pass, when your children will say to you, what do you mean by את־ this service? 27 That you will say, it is the sacrifice to ליהוה ליהוה את־ מון service in Egypt, when He struck ליהוה the Egyptians? *and* our houses *He* delivered. And the people bowed their heads and worshipped. *Prophecy Fulfilled-Ex.* 12:21-27 Messiah is our Passover-1 Cor. 5:7. 28 And the Children of Israel went away as had commanded and the C-MATS



29 And it came to pass at midnight and ויהוה killed all the firstborn in the land of Egypt, from the firstborn of Pharaoh that sat on his throne to the firstborn of the captive that *was* in the dungeon; and all the firstborn of *the* cattle. C-MATS

30 And Pharaoh rose up in the night, he and all his servants and all the Egyptians; and there was a great cry in Egypt; for *there was* not a house where one *was not* dead *in it*. C-MATS


Question: Why did every house have a corpse in it? Jashar 80 And Pharaoh rose up in the night, he and all his servants and all the Egyptians, and there was a great cry throughout Egypt in that night, for there was not a house in which there was not a corpse. אוד also killed the firstborn who were not known to everyone, like those who were the products of incest and immorality. Also the likenesses of the first born of Egypt, which were carved in the walls of their houses, were destroyed, and fell to the ground. Even the bones of their firstborn who had died before this and whom they had buried in their houses, were raked up by the dogs of Egypt on that night and dragged before the Egyptians and cast before them. All the Egyptians saw this evil, which had suddenly come upon them, and all the Egyptians cried out with a loud voice. All the families of Egypt wept upon that night, each man for his son and each man for his daughter, being the first born, and the cries of Egypt was heard at a distance on that night.

31 And Pharaoh called for Moses and Aaron by night and said, Rise up and get out from among my people, both אתם you and the Children of Israel; and go serve הוה את־ as you have said. 32 Also take your flocks and your herds as you have said and be gone, but bless אתי me also. C-MATS

Question: What blessing did Pharaoh want? Pray for me that I will not die, for I am a firstborn. (Chumash)

Question: Since Pharaoh was a firstborn, why wasn't he killed? Concerning him, אוה says: "And in very deed for את" this cause have I raised you up to show through you את" My power; and that My name may be declared throughout all the earth." (Exodus 9:16) at the Red Sea. C-MATS

33 And the Egyptians were urgent *with* the people *that* they might send them out of the land quickly; because they said, We *will* be all dead men. C-MATS



Middlebrow Answer: Death of the First-Born (10th)

34 And took the people את־ their dough before it was leavened and wrapped their kneading *bowls* in their clothes on their shoulders. 35 And *the* Children of Israel obeyed the word of Moses; and they borrowed *from* the Egyptians jewels of silver and gold and garments. C-MATS

Question: Why did the Egyptians give the Hebrews all their wealth? When the Hebrews came to ask their neighbors to borrow various items, the Egyptians gave them lavish gifts and forced their wealth on them, just so they would leave the country. (Chumash)

36 And את־ gave את־ favor to the people in the sight of the Egyptians, so that they granted them as much as they required. And they plundered את־ the Egyptians. 37 And the Children of Israel journeyed from Rameses to Succoth, about 600,000 men on foot, not counting the children.

Question: How many Hebrews left Egypt? 600,000 adult males did not include women, children, and elderly males, which indicates that a total population of about 3,000,000 people followed Moses into the Wilderness. (Chumash)

Question: יהוה did the impossible and brought the Israelites out of slavery from Egypt, the strongest nation in the world at that time. Is there anything that's truly impossible? Of course, there are some things that are simply beyond the laws of nature and no one can presume to accomplish them. For instance, no matter how much one wishes he could fly like a bird - he can't. However, there are many other things, accomplishments, etc., that feel impossible, but once we try to do what we can, we'll find that they were possible after all.

Question: Do we always see why things are for our best? No. Many, if not most of the time we don't. Still, we should remember that <u>nothing is random and mis working 'behind the scenes'</u> and sending us what we best need for our ultimate good and personal growth.

Question: Why do you think many things that seem so impossible at first are actually doable? One reason is that before we attempt any challenging task, there is part of us motivated by inertia and <u>fear that tries to hold us back</u>. One way it does so is by making the task appear more formidable than it really is. Once we get past that barrier, we're often surprised at how easily things go.

Question: How can thinking about the miracles of Passover empower us in our own lives? The Israelite people were lowly slaves in a terrible physical and spiritual state. Yet, through יהויה's miracles, they became a great spiritual nation until today. We too as individuals, even if we're feeling down and lowly, if we never stop trying to do what we can in every situation to improve our lives, may very well see יהויה's miracles too.

Question: How many years did the Israelites suffer hard labor? Jashar 81 And the children of Israel journeyed from Rameses to Succoth, about six hundred thousand men on foot, besides the little ones and their wives. Also a mixed multitude went up with them, and flocks and herds, even much cattle. And the sojourning of the children of Israel, who dwelt in the land of Egypt in hard labor, was two hundred and ten years. And at the end of two hundred and ten years, brought out the children of Israel from Egypt with a strong hand.

38 And a mixed multitude went up אתם with them; flocks, herds and cattle in very large numbers. C-MATS

Question: Who were the "mixed multitude" that went with the Hebrews into the Wilderness? A multitude of people of various nationalities converted to worship הוה and accompanied the Hebrews out of Egypt. (Chumash)

39 And they baked את־ the dough which they brought out of Egypt, unleavened cakes, because it was not leavened since they were driven out of Egypt and could not wait, neither had they prepared for themselves any meat. C-MATS

Question: What does this verse say about the faith of the Israelites? Israel did not say, "How will we go out into the desert without provisions?" Instead they believed and left. This is what is stated explicitly in Jeremiah 2:2: "I remember you, the kindness of your youth, אהָרָת you loved your espousals, when you went after Me in the wilderness, in a land *that was* not planted." C-MATS

40 Now the time the Children of Israel lived in Egypt was 430 years. C-MATS

Question: What does this mean "**Israel lived in Egypt 430 years**" when they really weren't in Egypt that many years? The Covenant between the Parts took place 430 years before the Exodus, and that is the period referred to in this verse. At that time, אור foretold Abraham that his offspring would endure 400 years during which there would be exile, persecution, and servitudebut not necessarily all of them at the same time. Thirty years later those 400 years began with the birth of Isaac, since the prophecy referred to Abraham's offspring. Thus the Exodus was perfectly calibrated to conform to the prophecy to Abraham, for Isaac was born on the fifteenth of Nissan and exactly 400 years later precisely at the deadline of the prescribed time the Hebrews were liberated. The actual exile in Egypt lasted 210 years. (Chumash) 41 And it came to pass at the end of *the* 430 years, on the very same day, it came to pass *that* all the אמי *ההוה hosts of ההוה went* out from the land of Egypt. 42 This night *was* observed *by* all *the* Children of Israel in their generations. 43 And אמר יהוה said to Moses and Aaron, *הוה this is* the ordinance of the Passover: No stranger will eat it: 44 But every man's servant *that* is bought for money, *after* you have circumcised *him*, then he will eat it. 45 A foreigner and a hired servant will not eat it. 46 In אחר *one* house it will be eaten; you will not carry *any* of the *meat* out of the house; neither will you break any of the bones. *Prophecy Fulfilled-Ex.* 12:46 Not a bone of the Lamb to be broken-John 19:31-36. 47 All the congregation of Israel will celebrate *ii ii* (*him*). 48 And when a stranger settles with *you* and keeps the Passover to *him* that is born in the land: no uncircumcised person will eat it. 49 The *same laws* will be for him that is native and the stranger that settles among you. 50 So *the* Children of Israel did all as commanded by *An*⁻ *math* the Children of Israel out of the land of Egypt by their armies. C-MATS




John Martin - One of the Seven Plagues of Egypt

Question: When did the Israelites leave Egypt? What did they take with them? Jashar 80: And the children of Israel delayed going out at night, and when the Egyptians came to them to bring them out, they said to them, "Are we thieves, that we should go out at night?" (They would not even wait until daylight.) And the children of Israel asked of the Egyptians, vessels of silver, and vessels of gold, and garments, and the children of Israel stripped the Egyptians. And Moses rose up and went to the river of Egypt, and brought up the coffin of Joseph and took it with him. The children of Israel also brought up each man's father's coffin with him, and each man the coffins of his tribe.

Question: How important is keeping the feast days? When King Jeroboam set up his secessionist monarchy of the Ten Tribes after the death of King Solomon, and wanted to prevent the Israelites of his kingdom from traveling to Jerusalem for the pilgrimage festivals -- where they would be reminded that the House of David was the legitimate ruler -- he set up golden statues of calves in his kingdom and established his own festivals for their worship (I Kings 12:28). He realized that observance of the festivals is the road to faith in אוני. So, too, is the Sabbath, which bears testimony that הוה יהוה created heaven and earth in six days and rested on the seventh.


Question: How important is continuing forward in the spirit of the feast days? The first Feast of Unleavened Bread the Israelites kept must have been exciting and exhilarating! They went out with boldness ("with a high hand"). It was on the Last Day of Unleavened Bread that they actually saw the Red Sea split in two, and they walked through it on dry ground. Then they witnessed Pharaoh's feared army being smashed beneath its crushing walls (Exodus 14:9-31). And yet, *just three days later*, they forgot this great deliverance and amazingly began to condemn Moses again (Exodus 15:24). But stop for a moment. Before we judge the Israelites too harshly, let's judge ourselves. How fast can we say or do things we later regret? We need to remember the words that Moses was charged to relay to the children of Israel on the banks of the Red Sea: "And "הוה said to Moses, Why do you cry to me? Speak to *the* Children of Israel to move forward: (Exodus 14:15)...Let's grow, overcome, change, and accomplish our part in ""s great Work that lies yet ahead of us. Let's not go backward, let's *go forward!*



Haftorah

Numbers 28:16 And on the fourteenth day of the first month *is* the Passover to ליהויה. 17 And on the fifteenth day of this month hold a feast: seven days unleavened bread will be eaten. 18 On the first day *have* a sacred convocation; you will not do any kind of ordinary work: 19 But you will offer a sacrifice made by fire *for* a burnt *offering* to ליהוה ; two young bullocks and one ram and seven lambs in *the* first year: they will be without blemish: 20 And their grain *offering will be of* flour mixed with oil: three tenths of an ephah (*six quarts*) you will offer for a bullock and two tenths of an ephah (*four quarts*) for a ram; 21 One tenth of an ephah (*two quarts*) you will offer for each of the seven lambs: 22 And one goat *for* a הקאת *sin [offering*] to make atonement for you. 23 Beside the burnt *offering* in the morning, which is for a burnt *offering*, you continually will offer ⁻ mathese. 24 In this way you will offer daily, *throughout the* seven days, the meat of the sacrifice made by fire, as a sweet savor to ⁻, it will be offered in addition to the continual burnt *offering* and its drink *offering*. 25 And on the seventh day you will have a sacred convocation; you will do no ordinary work. C-MATS

Y'hoshua 5:2 At that time יהוה said to Y'hoshua, Make knives of flint and again circumcise את־ Children of Israel the second time. 3 And Y'hoshua made him knives of flint and circumcised Children of Israel at the hill of the foreskins (Gibeath-haaraloth). 4 And this is the cause why Y'hoshua did circumcise: all the people that came forth out of Egypt, that were males, even all the men of war, died in the wilderness by the way, after they came forth out of Egypt. 5 For all the people that came out were circumcised; but all the people that were born in the wilderness by the way as they came forth out of Egypt, they had not been circumcised. 6 For the Children of Israel walked forty years in the wilderness, till all the nation, even the men of war that came forth out of Egypt, were consumed, because they listened not to the voice of יהוה swore that He would not let them see יהוה the land which יהוה swore to their fathers that He would give us, a land flowing with milk and honey. 7 and their children, who he raised up in their stead, אתם them did Y'hoshua circumcise: for they were uncircumcised, because they had not circumcised אותם *them* by the way. 8 And it came to pass, when they had finished circumcising the entire nation that they dwell in their places in the camp, till they were made whole (healed). 9 And יהוה said to Y'hoshua, This day have I rolled away את *the* reproach of Egypt from off you. Why the name of that place was called Gilgal (wheel), to this day. 10 And the Children of Israel encamped in Gilgal; and they kept the Passover on the fourteenth day of the month at even (twilight) in the plains of Jericho. 11 And they did eat of the produce of the land on the morrow after the Passover, unleavened cakes and parched grain, on the very same day. 12 And the Manna ceased on the morrow, after they had eaten of the produce of the land; neither had the Children of Israel Manna anymore; but they did eat of the fruit of the land of Canaan that year. 13 And it came to pass, when Y'hoshua was by Jericho, that he lifted up his eves and looked and, surely, there stood a man over against him with his sword drawn in his hand: and Y'hoshua went to him and said to him, are you for us, or for our adversaries? 14 And He said, Neither; but as Prince of the Host of יהוה am I now come. And Y'hoshua fell on his face to the earth and did worship and said to Him, what says my Adonai to His servant? 15 And the Prince of יהוה Host said to Y'hoshua, Take off your shoes from off your feet; for the place on which אתה you stand, on Him, is Sacred. And Y'hoshua did so. 6:1 Now Jericho was straightly shut up because of the Children of Israel: none went out and none came in. C-MATS





10 Y'shua said to him, "He who is washed does not need to wash his feet, but is clean: and you are clean, but not all of you." 11 For He knew who should betray Him, so He said, "You are not all clean." 12 So after He had washed their feet and put back on His garments and set down again, He said to them, "Do you know what I have done to you? 13 You call me Teacher and Master: and this is good; for so I am. 14 If I then, your Teacher and Master, have washed your feet; you also ought to wash one another's feet. 15 For I have given you an example, that you should do as I have done to you. 16 I say to you, The servant is not greater than his master; neither he that is sent greater than he that sent him. 17 If you know these things, you will be happy if you do them. 18 I speak not of you all: I know whom I have chosen: but that the scripture may be fulfilled. Let not your heart be troubled, neither let it be afraid. 28 You have heard how I said to you, I go away, and come again to you. If you loved Me, you would rejoice, because I said I go to the Father: for my Father is greater than I. 29 And now I have told you before it comes to pass, that when it comes to pass, you might believe. 30 Then I will not talk much with you: for the prince of this world comes, and has nothing in Me. 31 But that the world may know that I love the Father; and as the Father gave Me a command, even so I will do. Arise, let us go. C-MATS

15:1 I am the true vine, and my Father is the husbandman. 2 Every branch in Me that bears no fruit He takes away: and every branch that bears fruit, He purges it, that it may bring forth more fruit. 3 Now you are clean through the word which I have spoken to you. 4 Abide in Me, and I in you. As the branch cannot bear fruit by itself, unless it abides in the vine; neither can you unless you abide in Me. 5 I am the vine, you are the branches: He that abides in Me, and I in him, he brings forth much fruit: for without Me you can do nothing. 6 If a man does not abide in Me, he is cast forth as a branch, and is withered; and men gather them, and cast them into the fire, and they are burned. 7 If you abide in Me, and My words abide in you, you shall ask what you will, and it shall be done for you. 8 In this way my Father is glorified when you bear much fruit; so shall you be my disciples. 9 As the Father has loved Me, so have I loved you: continue in My love. 10 If you keep my commandments, you shall abide in My love; even as I have kept my Father's commandments, and abide in His love. 11 These things have I spoken to you, that My joy might remain in you, and that your joy might be full. 12 This is my commandment, That you <u>love one another</u>, as I have loved you. C-MATS



13 Greater love has no man than this, that a man lay down his life for his friends. 14 You are my friends, if you do whatsoever I command you. 15 Then I will not call you servants; because the servant does not know what his master does: but I have called you friends; for all things that I have heard from My Father I have made known to you. 16 You have not chosen Me, but I have chosen you and ordained you, that you should go and bring forth fruit and that your fruit should remain: that whatsoever you shall ask of the Father in my name, He may give it you. 17 These things I command you, that you love one another. 18 If the world hates you, you know that it hated Me before it hated you. 19 If you were of the world, the world would love his own: but because you are not of the world, but I have chosen you out of the world, therefore the world hates you. 20 Remember the word that I said to you, The servant is not greater than his master. If they have persecuted Me, they will also persecute you; if they have kept My saying, they will not keep yours also. C-MATS

21 But all these things will they do to you for My name's sake, because they do not know Him that sent Me. 22 If I had not come and spoken to them, they would not have sin: but now they have no excuse for their sin. 23 He that hates Me hates My Father also. 24 If I had not done among them the works which no other man did, they would have no sin: but now they have both seen and hated both Me and My Father. 25 But this comes to pass, that the word might be fulfilled that is written in their Torah, They hated Me without a cause. 26 But when the Comforter has come, whom I will send to you from the Father, even the Spirit of truth, which proceeds from the Father, he shall testify of Me: 27 And you also shall testify, because you have been with Me from the beginning. 16:1 These things have I spoken to you, that you should not be offended. 2 They shall put you out of the synagogues. The time comes, that whosoever kills you will think that he does Elohim service. 3 And these things will they do to you, because they have not known the Father, nor Me. 4 But these things have I told you, that when the time shall come, you may remember that I told you of them. And these things I said not to you at the beginning, because I was with you. 5 But now I go My way to Him that sent Me; and none of you ask Me, Where will you go? 6 But because I have said these things to you, sorrow has filled your heart. 7 Nevertheless I tell you the truth; It is expedient for you that I go away: for if I go not away, the Comforter will not come to you; but if I depart, I will send him to you. C-MATS



Coming of the Spirit

8 And when he is come, he will reprove the world of sin, and of righteousness, and of judgment: 9 Of sin, because they believe not in Me; 10 Of righteousness, because I go to my Father, and you see Me no more; 11 Of judgment, because the prince of this world is judged. 12 I have yet many things to say to you, but you cannot bear them now. 13 When he, the Spirit of truth, has come, he will guide you into all truth: for he shall not speak of himself; but whatsoever he shall hear, that shall he speak: and he will show you things to come. 14 He shall glorify Me: for he shall receive from Me, and shall show it to you. 15 All things that the Father has are Mine. In the world ye shall have tribulation: but be of good cheer; I have overcome the world." C-MATS

Yahusha's Prayer for His Disciples

17:1 These words spoke Y'shua, and lifted up His eyes to heaven, and said, "Father, the hour is come; glorify your Son, that your Son also may glorify you: 2 As you have given Him power over all flesh, that He should give eternal life to as many as you have given Him. 3 And this is life eternal, that they might know You the only true Elohim, and Y'shua haMashiach, whom you have sent. 4 I have glorified you on the earth: I have finished the work which you gave Me to do. 5 And now, O Father, glorify Me with your Ownself with the glory which I had with You before the world was. 6 I have manifested your name to the men which you gave Me out of the world: yours they were, and you gave them to Me; and they have kept your word. 7 Now they have known that all things whatsoever you have given Me are from You. C-MATS

Question: What is one of the main lessons of Passover? On Passover, Believers all over the world eat a special flatbread called matzah. The only difference between it and regular bread is that matzah is baked before it has a chance to puff up and rise. But bread isn't the only thing that can get puffy. People also sometimes puff themselves up by bragging and acting conceited. One of the big lessons of Passover is to un-puff ourselves and learn to be down to earth like the humble, sacred matzah.

TAKING THE CAKE

One of the highlights of Passover vacation was the annual spring science fair. Kids came together in a big auditorium from schools all over the state to display their award-winning projects and compete for the grand prize of a free trip to Israel. Though he hadn't won the grand prize, Alex Frankel was feeling pretty proud of himself, as one of judges had just told him he had won an honorable mention - and 50 dollars cash for his project on plant photosynthesis.

As Alex waited for his prize, he decided to go take a look at some of the other displays. He noticed that the kid in the booth next to him had done a project about how bread and cake rises and how unleavened matzah stayed matzah. "Hey, that's kind of neat," he said to the boy whose nametag had 'Josh' written on it. "Looks like you really worked hard, Josh. Too bad not *everyone* could win a prize like I did, isn't it?"

Josh smiled uncomfortably and nodded. Alex hoped he hadn't hurt the kid's feelings, but still he *had* earned the right to brag a bit, hadn't he? Head held high, Alex looked down from the top of his nose at the kid's project, and shook his head. "Don't mind me saying so Josh, but if you want to win a prize next year - like I did - you have to make things look a little more, um ... *professional.*"

Alex continued to give Josh a whole list of tips and pointers, while Josh listened carefully, nodding his head, and saying "good idea" every once in a while.

All of the sudden there was a big commotion. Alex turned around to see the whole panel of judges with big smiles on their faces, together with what looked like news reporters with big cameras wearing headphones, rushing his way.

They must be coming to give me my prize, he thought.

"Great talking to you Josh, better luck next time," Alex said hurriedly, as he tucked in his shirt and walked toward the delegation to accept his prize.

As the reporter got closer, Alex flashed his best prizewinner's smile and held out his hand. But instead of taking it, the man pushed him aside. "Sorry kid, no time for autographs. I've got a job to do."

Alex didn't get it. He turned on his heels and followed them, but didn't have to go far because the entire delegation stopped at the booth next to his, right in front of Josh! Flashbulbs started popping, and the head judge shook Josh's hand with a big smile and ceremoniously presented him with a free round-trip ticket to Israel.

Alex couldn't believe it. Josh had won the Grand Prize! And even more unbelievable was that the whole time he had been bragging about his own little prize, Josh knew he was the grand prizewinner and still just humbly stood there without saying a thing! After the excitement died down and everyone was packing up, Alex went back over to Josh and shook his hand. "I guess you think I'm pretty foolish, huh, bragging like I did, when you were the real winner?"

Josh just smiled sincerely and said, "Everyone here is a winner, prize or no prize," and offered Alex to take home one of the matzah snacks he had brought along.

Alex gratefully accepted and hoped that by eating the matzah this Passover he'd learn to be a bit more like it.

Question: How did Alex feel at first when he was talking to Josh? He felt proud that he had won a prize and wanted to brag about it to Josh who hadn't.

Question: How did Alex feel in the end? He was amazed that Josh had really won a much bigger prize than he did, but didn't brag at all. He felt silly for bragging and decided to be more humble for now on.

Question: Is there ever a time we should 'puff ourselves up'? There can be times that we have to stand up for our own legitimate rights or those of others. Also, we should like ourselves and not put ourselves down. But puffing up for the sake of bragging and making others feel bad has no place in a spiritual life.



PASSOVER SEDER

Reader 1: Let us prepare our hearts for the Passover Seder. We must consider ourselves as having personally been freed from Egypt. As we prepare for this experience of personal redemption, let us take the leaven of sin hidden within our hearts far away from us.

HAGGADAH (hah-gah-dah) means "the Telling" Seder means "order"

Exodus 12:11 You will eat אתו *it (him) with* your loin's girded (belt), your shoes on your feet and your staff in your hand; and you will eat אתו *it (him)* quickly, it is to ליהוה Passover. 12 For I will pass through the land of Egypt this night and will kill all the firstborn in the land of Egypt, both man and beast; and I will execute against all the gods of Egypt judgment: I am יהוה. 13 And the blood will be את־ *a sign* upon the houses where אתם *you are*: and when I see לאת blood, I will pass over you and the plague will not *come* upon you to destroy you when I strike the land of Egypt. 14 And this day will be a memorial for you; and you will keep it as a feast to ליהוה throughout all your generations; you will keep this feast as an ordinance forever. 15 Seven days you will eat unleavened bread; on the first day you will take away leaven out of your houses: whoever eats leavened bread from the first day until the seventh day will be cut off from Israel. 16 And on the first day there will be a sacred assembly and on the seventh day there will be a sacred assembly for you; no work will be done in *those days*, except *that* which every man must *do to prepare his* food to eat, you may only do that. 17 And you will observe את־ Unleavened Bread; for in this day I have brought את־ your armies out of the land of Egypt: therefore, you will observe את־ day, in all your generations by an ordinance forever (owlam). 18 In the first month, on the fourteenth day of the month at evening, you will eat unleavened bread until the twenty first day of the month at evening. 19 Seven days no leaven will be found in your houses: for whoever eats that which is leavened will be cut off from the Congregation of Israel, whether he is a stranger or born in the land. 20 You will eat nothing leavened; in all your houses you will eat unleavened bread. **C-MATS**

Blessed are You, הוה our Elohim, King of the universe, who chose us from all the people of the earth and has exalted us among all nations, by making us set apart with His commandments.

Reader 2: One of Yahusha's last earthly acts was the celebration of the Passover. Gathering His disciples in a small room in Jerusalem, Yahusha led them in a Seder.

Luke 2:11 And you shall say unto the good man of the house, "The Master said unto you, 'Where is the guest chamber, where I shall eat the Passover with my disciples?" 12 And he shall show you a large upper room furnished: there make ready. 13 And they went, and found as he had said unto them: and they made ready the Passover. 14 And when the hour was come, he sat down, and the twelve apostles with him. 15 And he said unto them, "With desire I have desired to eat this Passover with you before I suffer." C-MATS

It was there, in the context of this celebration that Yahusha revealed to them the mystery of rearin's plan of redemption. May we experience once again יהוה's great redemption. Blessed are You, יהוה our Elohim, King of the universe, who Has given us life and brought us to this happy season, and we thank Thee for sustaining us all to this day.

Reader 3: Light the candles (Candles are optional.)

As we kindle the festival lights, we pray for the illumination of the Spirit of יהוה to bring great personal meaning to this our Passover celebration.

Psalm 27:1 יהוה is my light and my salvation; who shall I fear? יהוה is the strength of my life; of who shall I be afraid? C-MATS

Blessed are You, יהוה our Elohim, King of the Universe, who has sent Thy Son, Thine Only Son, Yahusha the Messiah, to be the light of the world and our Passover Lamb, that through him we might have eternal life.

Exodus 6:1 Then יהוה said to Moses, now will you see what I will do to Pharaoh: with a strong hand will he let them go and with a strong hand will he drive them out of his land. C-MATS

As יהוה spoke these words of encouragement to Moses, יהוה revealed to His servant the plan by which He would redeem the children of Israel.

Exodus 6:6 Go say to the Children of Israel, I am יהוה and I will bring אתכָם you out from under the burdens of the Egyptians and I will take אתכָם you out of their bondage and I will redeem אתכָם you with a stretched out arm and with great judgments: 7 And I will take you to Me for a people and I will be to you an Elohim: and אתכָם you will know that I am יהוה your Elohim, who brought you out from under the burdens of the Egyptians. C-MATS

Reader 4: The Cup of Sanctification

(Lift your cup of wine.) Let us lift our cup together and bless the Name of יהוה! Blessed are You, יהוה our Elohim, Ruler of the universe, who creates the fruit of the vine.

Luke 22:17 And Yahusha took the cup, and gave thanks, and said, Take this, and divide it among yourselves: 18 For I say unto you, I will not drink of the fruit of the vine, until the kingdom of Elohim shall come. C-MATS

Let us drink. (Wait until everyone drinks.)

Reader 5: Unleavened Bread

On all other nights we eat bread with leaven, but on Passover we eat only Matzah, unleavened bread. As the children of Israel fled from Egypt, they did not have time for their dough to rise. Instead, the hot desert sun baked it flat. But even more than that, the scriptures teach us that leaven symbolizes sin.

1 Corinthian 5:7 Purge out the old leaven, that you may be a new lump, as you are unleavened. For even Mashiach our Passover is sacrificed for us. C-MATS

During this season of Passover, let us break our old habits of sin and selfishness and begin a fresh, new, and set apart life.

(Lift the plate which contains the Matzah.) This is the bread of affliction, the poor bread which our fathers ate in the land of Egypt. Let all who are hungry come and eat. Let all who are in need share in the hope of Passover. (Pass the Matzah, but do not eat it. Wait unless everyone has a piece.)

In the Matzah we can see a picture of Yahusha. See it is striped.

Isaiah 53:5 But He was wounded for our transgressions, He was bruised for our iniquities; the chastisement of our peace was upon Him; and <u>with His stripes we are healed</u>. C-MATS

See how the Matzah is pierced.

Zechariah 12:10 And I will pour upon the House of David and upon the inhabitants of Jerusalem, the spirit of grace and of supplication; and they shall look to Me את whom <u>they have pierced</u>; and they shall mourn for Him, as one mourns for *his* only *son* and shall be in bitterness for Him, as one that is in bitterness for his first-born. C-MATS

John 6:35 And Yahusha said unto them, <u>I am the bread of life</u>: he that comes to me shall never hunger; and he that believes on me shall never thirst. C-MATS

Luke 22:19 And he (*Yahusha*) took bread, and gave thanks, and broke it, and gave unto them, saying, This is my body which is given for you: this do in remembrance of me. C-MATS

Blessed are You, יהוה, King of the universe, who brings forth bread from the earth. (Take a small bite of the Matzah.)

Reader 6: Bitter Herbs

(*Lift the bitter herbs.*) On all other nights we eat all kinds of vegetables, but on Passover we eat bitter herbs. As sweet as our lives are today, let us still remember how bitter life was for the children of Israel in the land of Egypt.

Exodus 1:11 Therefore, they set over them taskmasters to afflict אתר (him) with their burdens. And they built treasure cities for Pharaoh את־ Pithom את־ and Raamses. 12 But the more they afflicted them, the more they multiplied and grew. And the Egyptians were grieved because of the Children of Israel. 13 And made the Egyptians and Children of Israel labor rigorously: 14 And they made bitter את־ their lives with hard bondage, in mortar and in brick and in all manner of service in the field: את all their service, which they made them serve, was with cruelty. C-MATS

(Put bitter herbs on your Matzah, but do not eat. Pass the bitter herbs.) As we scoop bitter herbs onto a piece of Matzah, let us allow the bitter taste to cause us to shed tears of compassion for the sorrow that our ancestors knew thousands of years ago. (Wait for everyone to prepare the bitter herbs.)

Blessed are You, יהוה, King of the universe, who has set us apart by Your Word and commanded us to eat bitter herbs. *(Everyone eats.)*

Reader 7: The Lamb

This roasted lamb represents the lamb whose blood marked the houses of the children of Israel, signifying their obedience to הוה 's command.

John 1:29 The next day John saw Yahusha coming unto him, and said, <u>Behold the Lamb of</u> <u>Elohim</u>, which takes away the sin of the world. C-MATS

Exodus 12:3 Speak to all the congregation of Israel saying, In the tenth *day* of this month every man will take a lamb according to house of their אבר *fathers*, a lamb for *each* house: 5 Your *animal should* be without blemish, a one year old male: you can take it from the sheep or goats: 6 And you will keep *it* until the fourteenth day of the same month: and the whole assembly of the congregation of Israel will kill ארו (*him*) in the evening. 7 And they will take the blood and *smear it* on the two side posts and on the upper door post of the houses in which they shall eat ארו (*him*). 8 And they will eat ארי the flesh that night roast *it* with fire and *eat it with* unleavened bread *and* bitter *herbs*. 11 You will eat ארו (*him*) with your loin's girded (*belt*), your shoes on your feet and your staff in your hand; and you will eat ארו *it* (*him*) quickly, it *is* to ארו אפר א sover. 13 And the blood will be asign upon the houses where upon you are: and when I see ארו blood, I will pass over you and the plague will not *come* upon *you* to destroy you when I strike the land of Egypt. C-MATS

The blood of Yahusha over your body is a sign, and when יהוה sees the blood He gives you life not death.

Acts 20:28 Take heed therefore unto yourselves, and to all the flock, over the which the Ruach haKodesh has made you overseers, to feed the assembly of Elohim, which <u>He has purchased with</u> <u>His own blood.</u> C-MATS

Romans 3:25 Who Elohim has set forth to be a sacrifice of atonement through faith in his blood, to declare his righteousness for the remission of sins that are past, through the forbearance of Elohim; 26 To declare, I say, at this time his righteousness: that he might be just, and the justifier of him which believes in Yahusha. C-MATS

How great is איהוה''s goodness to us! For each of His acts of mercy and kindness we declare, "It would have been sufficient." If איהוה had merely rescued us, but had not judged the Egyptians, "It would have been sufficient." איהוה had only destroyed their gods, but had not parted the Red Sea, "It would have been sufficient." איהוה had only drowned our enemies, but had not fed us with manna, "It would have been sufficient." איהוה had only drowned our enemies, but had not fed us with manna, "It would have been sufficient." איהוה had only led us through the desert, but had not given us the Shabbat, "It would have been sufficient." But איהוה, blessed be He, provided all of these blessings for our ancestors and not only these, but so many more.

Philippians 4:19 But my Elohim shall supply all your needs according to His riches in glory by Mashiach Yahusha. C-MATS

Blessed are You, O יהוה, for You have in mercy supplied all our needs. You have given us Yahusha, forgiveness for sin, life abundant, and life everlasting, Halleluiah!

AFTER THE MEAL:

(Patriarch of the House): The Cup of Redemption

This is the cup of redemption, symbolizing the Blood of the Passover lamb. It was the cup "after supper" with which Yahusha identified Himself. The Prophet Isaiah reminds us in Isaiah 59:1 Surely התוה hand is not shortened, that it cannot save; neither his ear heavy that it cannot hear. 16 And He saw that there was no man and wondered that there was no intercessor: therefore, <u>His own arm brought salvation to Him</u>; and His righteousness, it upheld Him. C-MATS

Yahusha lifted the cup saying, Luke 22:20 This cup is the new covenant in my blood, which is shed for you. C-MATS

Just as the blood of the lamb brought salvation in Egypt, so Yahusha's redeeming death can bring salvation to all who believe. Blessed are You, יהוה our Elohim, King of the universe, who creates the fruit of the vine. Let's all drink and remember Yahusha's Blood was freely given for us. (*Pass the Silver Chalice or Cup and let all drink from it.*)

Before the birth of John the Baptizer, an angel of יהוה said. (Luke 1:17) And he shall go before him in the spirit and power of Elijah, to turn the hearts of the fathers to the children, and the disobedient to the wisdom of the just; to make ready a people prepared for יהוה. C-MATS

Later Yahusha spoke of John. Matthew 11:12 And from the days of John the Baptizer until now the kingdom of heaven suffers violence, and the violent take it by force. 13 For all the prophets and the Torah prophesied until John. 14 And if you will receive it, this is Elijah, which was for to come. 15 He that has ears to hear, let him hear. C-MATS

It was this same John who saw Yahusha and declared. John 1:29 The next day John saw Yahusha coming to him, and said, Behold the Lamb of Elohim, which takes away the sins of the world. 30 This is he of whom I said, After me comes a man which is preferred before me: for he was before me. 31 And I knew him not: but that he should be made manifest to Israel, therefore am I come baptizing with water. 32 And John gave testimony, saying, I saw the Spirit descending from heaven like a dove, and it abode upon him. 33 And I knew him not: but he that sent me to baptize with water, the same said unto me, Upon whom you shall see the Spirit descending, and remaining on him, the same is he which baptizes with the Ruach haKodesh. 34 And I saw, and gave testimony that this is the Son of Elohim. C-MATS

Our Passover Seder is now complete. May we always remember the sacrifice Yahusha made for us. Everyone says: "Next year in Jerusalem."

Patriarch will read the story of *The Deliverance of Our Ancestors* to the children: Exodus chapters 7-11, 12:29-42, 13:17-14:31

Question: Should you include the washing of the feet as an example of what Yahusha did for His Disciples at the Passover Seder?

You may also include this optional reading during the Seder, if you desire to do so.

Reader: Psalm 24:3 Who shall ascend into the hill of יהוה? And who shall stand in His holy place? 4 He that has clean hands and a pure heart; who has not lifted up his soul to falsehood and has not sworn deceitfully. 5 He shall receive a blessing מאת *from* מאת and righteousness from the Elohim of his salvation. C-MATS

(Lift the basin of water.) Let us now offer the bowl of water to one another and share in this hand washing ceremony. Let us also reflect upon the gesture of humility and the lesson of commitment made by Yahusha, when, on the night, He laid aside His garments and girded Himself with a towel.

John 13:4 Yahusha rose from supper, and laid aside his garments; and took a towel, and wrapped himself. 5 After that he pours water into a basin, and began to wash the disciples' feet, and to wipe them with the towel that he was wrapped. 12 So after he had washed their feet, and had taken his garments, and was set down again, he said unto them, "Do you know what I have done to you? 13 You call me Teacher and Master: and rightly so; for so I am. 14 If I then, your Teacher and Master, have washed your feet; you also ought to wash one another's feet. 15 For I have given you an example, that you should do as I have done to you." C-MATS

(Wash your hands and dry them on your napkin. Pass the bowl of water. Wait until all have washed their hands.)

Book of Jasher or Book of the Just Man Joshua 10:13 And the Sun stood still and the Moon stayed, until the nation had avenged themselves of their enemies. Is not this written in the book of Jashar? And the Sun stayed in the midst of heaven and delayed not going down about a whole day. 2 Sam 1:18 And he bade them teach the Children of Judah the song of the bow: surely, it is written in the book of Jashar. (The Septuagint translation renders sefer hayashar in both cases as 'Book of the Just'. The reference to the bow is here missing, so that the text reads: And he gave orders to teach it the sons of Iouda: behold it is written in the Book of the Just.)
